I. Hospital Services :--

- Total patients attended in OPD : 50,263

II. Workshops, Training & Events :

- The **Department of Pharmacology**, AIIMS Nagpur in collaboration with the **Indian Society for Clinical Research (ISCR)** and **Canvass Clinical Research Pvt. Ltd.** Organized "**International Clinical Trial Day**" celebration on **2nd May 2025**. 21 clinical trial participants were honored with 4 sharing heartfelt testimonials – reaffirming the human impact of clinical research.



- The **Department of Microbiology**, in association with the **Department of Nursing** organized impactful session for healthcare professional, interns and Residents, patients and visitors to observe **World Hand Hygiene Day** on **5th May 2025** – reaffirming our commitment to infection prevention & patient safety through effective hand hygiene practices. The theme for this year is “It might be gloves, its always hand hygiene.



- **The Department of Community Medicine** on the occasion of “National Dengue Day – 16.5.2025” organized a series of activities aimed at strengthening public health preparedness. These included a focused training session for Medical Officers of NMC, Nagpur and community awareness.



- On the occasion of **World Schizophrenia Day**, the **Department of Psychiatry** in collaboration with **Tele-MANAS Mentoring Unit** organized a public awareness program to highlight the barriers faced by individuals with schizophrenia on **24th May 2025**. - On the occasion of **World No Tobacco Day**, **Tobacco Cessation Centre** in collaboration with **Department of Psychiatry, Department of Community Medicine, Department of ENT, Department of Pulmonary Medicine, Department of Dentistry, Department of Surgical Oncology** and **Tele MANAS Mentoring Unit** organized a Screening Camp for patients of Tobacco Use Disorder on **31st May 2025** at ENT OPD Waiting area, 2nd Floor, OPD Building, AIIMS Nagpur.

III. Achievements:

- As a testament to the Institute’s advanced capabilities and commitment to providing cutting edge neonatal care, a new benchmark in the regions medical history was set at AIIMS, Nagpur. A multidisciplinary team comprising of CVTS Surgeons and Padiatric Surgeon with critical intraoperative support from Cardiac Anaesthetist, Neonatologists, Residents and Nursing staff performed a **Patent Ductus Arteriosus**

(PDA) litigation on a 900 gram pre term infant and ensured the infant's post-surgery care and recuperation.

IV. Miscellaneous activities:

- As per instructions received from MoHFW (Training Division) vide O.M dated 9/5/2025, the Department of Health and Family Welfare had decided to conduct a Webinar Series "Emergency Preparedness and Response" As part of the series, the information regarding webinar scheduled on 10th May 2025 on Title: **Wound management and Infection Prevention and Control (IPC)** was disseminated to all employees and ensured active participation.
- A MOU was signed on 23.5.2025 between AIIMS, Nagpur and NTPC, Mouda for "Infrastructure Development for BMT unit at AIIMS Nagpur and patient support for Bone Marrow transplantation" under CSR funds.

AIIMS to maintain high alert despite ceasefire: Director Dr Joshi

Nagpur: Even as govt sources confirmed that a ceasefire was declared along the border, AIIMS Nagpur will continue its state of preparedness.

Director Dr PP Joshi confirmed that the circular issued regarding the cancellation of leaves for doctors, nurses, and support staff will remain in force.

"There was no official communication from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare or the Health Secretary regarding any change in the current status. Hence, the alert level at AIIMS Nagpur will be maintained," Dr Joshi told TOI.

He emphasised that AIIMS, being a central institute, must be ready for deployment or support in any part of the country if needed. "We must stay alert and continue to be on our toes," he said.

On the subject of mock drills, Dr Joshi added, "Emergency preparedness is a regular process at institutions like AIIMS. Mock drills are not reactionary but part of routine planning. We will conduct them as per our internal schedules."
